Attendance:

It is our goal to provide a safe, comfortable and fun summer school experience for students. While attendance is not mandatory we would appreciate a note or a phone call (727-5296) before 8:00am for absences. Please make every effort to have your child in school on time. There will be limited supervision before and after summer school.

Code of Conduct:

All students are expected to abide by the rules outlined in the Behavior Expectations: Student Conduct section of the Iao School Student/Parent Handbook (iaoschool.org) as well as the Hawaii Administrative Rules Title 8 Chapter 19. Please ask for this information if you are not familiar with the school's rules. If your child is dismissed for disciplinary reasons or is absent for any reason, tuition is nonrefundable. Attendance will be taken in each class but it is the student's responsibility to attend class.

Dress Standards:

~~Attire that is distracting, provocative or overly casual should not be worn to school.~~

This includes thin spaghetti strap tops such as camisoles, backless/strapless halter tops, see through or bare midriff garments, casual tops where undergarments such as bikini tops, bralettes, bandeaus are showing as well as off the shoulder tops. Shorts and skirts need to be an appropriate length (with arms to the side, hem must fall below longest finger tip). No short shorts or ripped shorts/pants that show underwear or skin. Students may wear printed t-shirts/shorts (no gang, drugs, alcohol, sex prints). Footwear is mandatory. Athletic shoes are recommended for cooking and fitness classes. You will be called to pick up your child if appropriate clothes are not worn to school. **Your child may need to follow the regular school dress code (Iao School uniform shirt) if dress standards are not met.**

Students are encouraged to bring water and healthy snacks. Affordable snacks will be sold during recess from 6/8/18.

David Kuraya will be teaching band classes. He currently is the Band Director. (Room H1)

David Birmingham currently teaches grade 6 physical education classes at lao School and will be the physical fitness instructor. He is a certified teacher. (Room H2)

Leah Kikuchi teaches grade 6 math at lao School. She will be engaging students in middle school math as well as directing students in the use of math based computer programs. These computer-based enrichment programs will engage students in current math concepts. (Portable 7)
